HST 2200- MORDERN WOLRD HISTORY

COURSE DESCRIPITION

This course is a brief examination of the ideas, events and movements that have influenced the nature and structure of modern sovereign nations both in the Old World and the New. If focuses on major development from the medieval period to decolonization in the Post-World-War two period. The subjects include feudalism, the Renaissance and Reform; European colonial Empires; the 18th and 20th century revolution; the 19th century ISMS; the world war and their aftermath and the changes in the Arab World.
